



Hello,

Restore Texas Ministries is a 9-month life recovery program. Our vision is to be a partner ministry with other like-minded, Christian, life-recovery ministries in Texas that take in addicted people and people with life problems and lay the important groundwork in Christian and addiction recovery education. So we see ourselves as a second phase life recovery program that is set up to partner with first phase life recovery centers.

When clients are ready and have strengthened their walk with the Lord and have developed necessary people skills, they transition from other first phase programs to our second phase program. We begin mentoring them through weekly evaluations and train them in job skills (focusing on the trades), and work on find them a job. As they earn enough money, we buy them a car, get them set up in a place to live, and position them around people that will continue to hold them accountable so they may live the life that God has always meant for them to live.

Men first come in and serve their brothers (e.g., help other men get on their feet; men that were in the program first). Those men do well in the program and therefore stay in the program receives \$1000 per month in months 7, 8 and 9 (the money is placed in a bank account). Men who complete all 9 months, and therefore graduate, receive a bonus of \$1500. Graduates then have \$4500 to buy a car and get an apartment.

We are a live-in facility. We currently have the capacity to house 12 men. There are supervisors that live at the facility. We just finished expanding our wastewater facilities to accommodate over 25 men on our property in the future.

It is the policy of the Restore Texas Ministries to provide equal educational and employment opportunities and not to illegally discriminate based on race or color in its educational programs, activities, employment, and personnel policies.

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General Information

This following is a description of how Restore Texas Ministries is setup to operate as of June 23, 2017. This is not an exhaustive description, but it intends to give one an overview of the ministry. These policies may be rescinded, edited, and/or added to at any time without verbal or written notice.

How the ministry is funded:

- 1) We do not receive government funding.
- 2) Men living at Restore work to pay the day-to-day expenses of Restore.
- 3) With this in mind, men are required to work 40 hours per week to pay the bills, and there is no sick time benefit nor is there holiday pay (we are not a for profit corporation or a state agency). Each day off (e.g., holiday or court day etc.) results in a \$100 deduction (his pay) from the final benefit. If a man is sick, it costs him \$100 per day (his pay). Another option for each man when sick is to make up the work time on a Saturday. This is a firm, static policy.

What men get:

- 1) Food, housing, work boots (after one month) and one pair of work gloves.
- 2) Men are given a bi-monthly incidental stipend on the 1st and the 15th (currently \$25).
- 3) When men enter Final Phase (the last three months of their stay), by seniority, they earn \$1000 month for the last three months. A full month must be completed--to the day. There is zero benefit for a partial month if a man leaves early or is exited. Forty hours a week of work is required to earn this benefit. Sick time has the potential to affect these amounts.
- 4) Men receive a \$1500 graduation bonus if they complete the program. The maximum benefit at Restore is \$4500. This is the absolute cap (save overtime work; see below). These funds are used to buy each graduate a car and get an apartment.
- 5) A school welding and carpentry shop is provided for students to learn and/or strengthen a trade.
- 6) Assistance with job placement services or starting a business (if approved by leadership).
- 7) The ministry leadership's focused efforts when on final phase.
- 8) Men may have their own vehicle at Restore upon approval of the director (generally towards the end of the program).
- 9) Men rarely receive an additional amount of money each month depending on need assessments via leadership evaluation.
- 10) Mentoring
- 11) Men are allowed to have a cell phone at the direction of the director, usually toward the end of Final Phase (the last 4-7 weeks of the program), but one must not use it for social media, texting and the like while on any job.

What men must do:

- 1) Men must be physically able to work while at Restore. If at any time a man cannot work, he must immediately make other housing arrangements. Unfortunately, we are not setup as a medical facility.

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- 2) Men must have a work ethic that deserves \$12/hour. (In other words: a man cannot be a lazy person and stay at Restore.) This will be evaluated weekly.
- 3) Men must put in 40 hours of work per week plus do chores (e.g., mow the grounds, clean the house, etc.).
- 4) When a man first comes to Restore, he is on work crew immediately.
- 5) Men must perform their duties as assigned by the director, dorm supervisor, and team leads.
- 6) If RTM pays anything for a man (e.g., court costs, dentist, doctor, etc.), these funds come out of one's total benefit up front.
- 7) Men must maintain a drug and alcohol-free lifestyle. There is zero tolerance for violations for drug or alcohol use. If a man uses drugs or alcohol, he will be exited immediately from the program.
- 8) Men enter the Final Phase (school phase, job phase, or business phase--the last three months) at Restore on a first come first served basis.
- 9) Men must come off Final Phase temporarily if men leave or are removed from the program when necessary. Although rare, it is a possibility.
- 10) There is no moonlighting at RTM (i.e., side jobs arranged by clients). Men will be removed for this violation.
- 11) Restore's leadership makes every effort to find 40 hours/week of work for every man. There are times where this is not possible (e.g., work slowdowns; men's poor work ethics). Not working 40 hours/week will result in a lower benefit overall benefit. The benefit is lowered at a rate of \$10/hour.
- 12) All hours are added and averaged when a man finishes the program. If his hours are over 40 he is paid at \$12/hr (or a lower rate if we are unable to secure that rate for a particular man, e.g., \$10/hr).
This is the only factor that could increase the maximum benefit.
- 13) Church, Bible Studies, Chaplain's group discussions, etc. are all mandatory.
- 14) All men must understand that their enthusiasm matters: every job is an opportunity for more work. Every job is a mini-interview and a reflection of a man's character. Men who understand this typically end the program better off.

Men will be exited for the following reasons (and others not listed here as well)

- 1) Creating conflicts in the ministry (e.g., creating drama, constant self-centeredness, being uncooperative with leadership, etc.).
- 2) Committing an arrestable crime, state or federal (speeding tickets may result in removal from RTM's driving list).
- 3) Violating a major policy or for multiple offenses of minor policies.
- 4) Being uncooperative.
- 5) Bringing a firearm of any kind onto the property.
- 6) Being emotionally unstable and not making progress in changing it. (RTM is committed to each man. We provide professional counseling services when men are struggling with emotional issues.)
- 7) Missing spiritual growth meetings.
- 8) Moonlighting at RTM (i.e., "side jobs" or "off the books" work arranged by clients).
- 9) For other reasons not listed here that the director and/or Board of Directors feels deserving of an eviction.
